
FarmWorks was founded in May 2011 to provide a mechanism for citizens to invest in farms and food production through a Community Economic Development Investment Fund.

Food Production in Nova Scotia

Over 60 years production of non-fishery food in NS has decreased from approximately 60% sufficiency to about 15% (8% supply managed, 3% crops, 2% livestock) and exports have declined Farms have decreased from 12,518 to 3,905 Farm population decreased from 58,000 to 8,000 Loss to communities, food security, economy Strategies are needed to help reverse the trend

Food is A Key to Reversing Decline in Rural NS Population



Nova Scotia 2011

- 921,727 population (up 0.9% from 2006)
 - 600,003 (65.1%) urban
 - 321,724 (34.9%) rural
- 52,939 square km total area
 - 403,000 ha total farm area
 - 138,000 ha currently in crops or pasture
 - 1,200,000 ha with potential for crops and pasture
- \$524 M total farm income (up \$24 M from 2010)
- \$45 M net farm income (up \$21 M from 2010)
- Significant potential for food production investment needed to regain food infrastructure lost over time
